NHL PLAYOFF ROUNDUP

Killorn does in Devils

 The good news for the Tampa Bay Lightning is they're up, 2-0, on New Jersey in the first round of the playoffs and still haven't played their best hockey.

Alex Killorn scored twice during a four-goal second period, helping the top seed in the Eastern Conference beat the visiting Devils, 5-3, on Saturday in Game 2 of the best-of-seven series.

The Atlantic Division champions scored three times in a 2:47 span in the second period, and the reeling Devils pulled goalie Keith Kinkaid after Killorn's third goal in two games made it 5-1 with 6:48 remaining in the period.

Kinkaid, whose stellar play since January helped New Jersey finish strong and claim its first playoff berth since 2012, yielded five goals on 15 shots.

Nikita Kucherov, Brayden Point, and Tyler Johnson also scored for Tampa Bay, which is up 2-0 in the series after going 0-2-1 against the Devils during the regular season.

Andrej Vasilevskiy stopped 41 shots, limiting the Devils to rookie Nico Hischier's unassisted goal in the opening period, Sami Vatanen's sixth career playoff goal late in the second, Blake Coleman's third-period tally that trimmed Tampa Bay's lead to 5-3 with eight minutes left.

Goalie Cory Schneider came off the bench to help the Devils stay in the game with 10 saves, nine in the final period.

Predators 5, Avalanche 4 — Ryan Hartman's empty-net goal with 1:09 left wound up the game-winner as host Nashville held off Colorado for a 2-0 lead in their first-round Western Conference series.

Hartman's goal gave the Predators a 5-3 lead until Alexander Kerfoot pulled Colorado within 5-4 with 35.8 seconds left. But the Avalanche couldn't get another puck past goalie Pekka Rinne.

The Presidents' Trophy winners started slowly, giving up a goal on Colorado's first shot for a second straight game. Yet the Predators rallied again to take their first 2-0 lead when starting a best-of-seven series in their own building.

Kevin Fiala had a goal and an assist, and Viktor Arvidsson, Ryan Johansen, and Austin Watson scored a goal apiece. P.K. Subban and Mattias Ekholm each had two assists for Nashville, which has won 12 straight over the Avalanche.

Rinne made 26 saves for the win.

Erik Haula's goal in double overtime gave Vegas a 2-1 victory over the visiting Los Angeles Kings on Friday night for a 2-0 lead in their first-round playoff series.

With less than five minutes on the clock in the second overtime, James Neal skated into the zone, looked past Alex Tuch, and instead found a streaking Haula, who skated in on his own to beat goalie Jonathan Quick and send a towel-waving crowd of 18,588 into a frenzy.

Game 3 in the best-of-seven Western Conference series is Sunday night in Los Angeles.

Tuch scored for expansion Vegas in regulation, and Paul LaDue had the Kings' goal.

Marc-Andre Fleury made 29 saves for the Golden Knights. Quick stopped 54 shots for the Kings.

NBA PLAYOFF ROUNDUP

76ers dominate Heat

 Ben Simmons had 17 points, 14 assists, and 9 rebounds in his playoff debut, and the 76ers romped again without Joel Embiid, beating the Miami Heat, 130-103, on Saturday night in Philadelphia for their 17th straight win.

Embiid was a spectator in Game 1 of the first-round series because of a broken orbital bone around his left eye.

Simmons dished and dazzled in the paint and the Heat had no answer for Sixers reserves Marco Belinelli and Ersan Ilyasova.

Belinelli and Ilyasova combined to hit four 3-pointers in the third quarter that helped shift the tone from physical and foul-filled to a long-distance game that allowed the Sixers to put away this one. They used a 15-0 run in the third in their first postseason game in five seasons under coach Brett Brown to get the rout rolling.

JJ Redick scored 28 points to lead the Sixers. Belinelli had 25 and Ilyasova 17. Former Celtic Kelly Olynyk led the Heat with 26 points.

The Sixers, who set an NBA record with 16 straight wins to end the season, got the rout in full swing with a raucous crowd behind them. The Heat shot 26 percent in the third and were outscored, 34-18.

Raptors 114, Wizards 106 — Serge Ibaka had 23 points and 12 rebounds, Delon Wright scored 11 of his 18 points in the fourth quarter, and host Toronto snapped a 10-game losing streak in playoff series openers by beating Washington.

DeMar DeRozan added 17 points, C.J. Miles and OG Anunoby each had 12, and Kyle Lowry had 11 points and nine assists for the Raptors, whose only previous victory in the

opening game of a playoff series came in the second round against Philadelphia in 2001.

Toronto entered having lost an NBA-worst 10 consecutive Game 1s since, including six at home.

The top-seeded team in the Eastern Conference, Toronto made 16 of 30 3-point attempts, with Miles making four, and

Ibaka and Wright each hitting three.

John Wall had 23 points and 15 assists for the Wizards, while Markieff Morris had 22 points and 11 rebounds. The Wizards' Bradley Beal added 19 points.

Warriors 113, Spurs 92 — Kevin Durant helped the defending champions get defensive in a hurry, finishing with 24 points, 6 rebounds, and 7 assists and Golden State returned to its old dominant self at playoff time to beat cold-shooting San Antonio in Oakland.

Klay Thompson found his shooting touch and scored 27 points, making 11 of 13 shots, while 7-footer JaVale McGee started in coach Steve Kerr's center-by-committee approach and contributed 15 points, 4 rebounds, and 2 blocked shots in 16 minutes. Draymond Green contributed 12 points, 11 assists, and 8 rebounds.

Rudy Gay led the Spurs with 15 points off the bench as leading scorer LaMarcus Aldridge was limited to 14 points on 5-for-12 shooting.
